












RIB:

In knitting, ribbing is a pattern in which vertical stripes of stockinet stitch alternate with vertical stripes of a reverse stockinet stitch. These two types of stripes may be separated by other stripes in which knit and purl stitches alternate vertically; such plissé stripes, which add width and depth to ribbing but not more elasticity.
